... is the principle whereby Internet access providers must treat internet traffic equally.

Currently, an increasing number of mobile Internet access providers are discriminating between online services on the basis of the cost of accessing them.

## "ZERO RATING"

...means that consumers have a limited amount of download capacity for the Internet, but have unlimited access to certain sites.

There is no clear ban on **"zero rating"** in the proposal that was agreed between the EU institutions.

Visit some sites as much as you want...



...but visit any other site and you'll have to pay.

## IS THIS NET NEUTRALITY?

Zero rating violates net neutrality.

Therefore, it should be prohibited.

When the download limit is reached, the European Parliament website, for example, **will be blocked**, but sites like Facebook are available "for free".

## WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

It means that big online monopolies get special treatment, to the cost of start-ups, political websites, blogs...
